What is Junior Achievement?

What is the role of Junior Achievement Volunteers?

Junior Achievement volunteers serve as instructors in local k-12 school classrooms presenting structured activity-based curriculum developed by Junior Achievement. Volunteers compliment the curriculum by sharing their personal, educational, and professional experiences with their Junior Achievement students.

What is the time commitment for a Junior Achievement volunteer?

- Elementary School requires five 30 to 45 minute classroom presentations
- Middle School requires six 45 to 60 minute classroom presentations
- High School requires five to seven 60 minute presentations

All classroom presentations require preparation time before entering the classroom.

How are Junior Achievement volunteers prepared to serve as instructors?

Junior Achievement volunteers participate in a one-hour orientation session prior to entering the classroom.

Are teachers in the classroom during the Junior Achievement presentations?

Yes, classroom teachers are required to stay in the classroom and often help to promote discussion.

Where do Junior Achievement volunteers serve as instructors?

Junior Achievement instructors teach in area k-12 schools near their homes or places of employment.

Do Junior Achievement volunteers select their school?

Yes.

How many students does a Junior Achievement volunteer instruct?

Average 20 to 25 students.
